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# CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES

## Contributions and Charges Information

The information contained in this booklet is provided to assist families understand the structure for College charges and contributions - your child's **personal** account is also with this pack and confirms the subjects your child will be taking in 2026.

Under Government guidelines, the College requests contributions from parents to assist in providing resources for the education of their children. These are used to provide resources for the compulsory areas: English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities and Social Sciences, Technology & Enterprise, The Arts, Physical Education and Health including hire of textbooks or the provision of text materials.

The payment of Voluntary Contributions and Compulsory Charges can take place prior to the first day for students at our Administration Office. Applications can be completed for the Education Program Allowance at this time – please bring with you the relevant Concession Cards and your bank details to assist your application.

Kiara College is an outstanding Independent Public School that provides quality teaching across a broad range of engaging and interesting courses. The Kiara College Board has reviewed and endorsed the Contributions and Charges for 2026, to ensure that we are acting in accordance with the Education Act.

## Where do the Contributions and Charge Payments go?

For Years 7 to 10, the maximum voluntary contributions the College can charge is \$235.00, this is used for items such as: in-class textbooks and resources, art materials, ingredients for food production, timber, metal and consumable tools, sporting equipment and so on.

Declining to pay voluntary contributions may mean we cannot maintain the high standard of educational materials for your child. We encourage you to pay these costs and offer a range of family friendly payment facilities.

For Years 11 and 12 there are no maximum charges that are set by the State Government, however the College sets reasonable charges for the subjects. It is important to note that ALL subject costs in Years 11 and 12 are compulsory.

You are encouraged to pay your Contributions and Charges before the end of Term 1. Funds received are used to purchase resources throughout the year. We are aware that for some families this may be a burden and advise it is possible to negotiate a payment plan. To arrange a plan, please contact our Administration Office.

## Personal Items and Booklist

Recommended personal and stationery items are included with this pack. These items may be purchased from **Campion Education**, our preferred supplier, who has discounted most stationery items by 20% and has various discounts on textbooks. You have the option to purchase from other suppliers or retail stores.



# CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES

## Assistance Schemes Available

The Secondary Assistance Scheme allowance is for students in full-time secondary education – Years 7 to 12. The assistance provided is \$235 which is deducted from the student's Voluntary Contributions and Charges account. There is an additional \$300 Clothing Allowance that is also provided. The Clothing Allowance can be directed towards College costs or reimbursed direct to you. To check if you are eligible, please refer to the information provided with this package. The claim form is also included. Recipients of Centrelink payments who hold a current Centrelink card may qualify for financial assistance towards their child's education. If you are eligible, please complete and bring the form to Administration Office, together with your current Centrelink/Health Care Card. PLEASE NOTE: **Applications close Thursday 2 April 2026.** No late applications will be accepted.

## ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance

You may qualify for ABSTUDY which you can apply for through the Department of Human Services. If you receive ABSTUDY you can also apply for ABSTUDY Supplement Allowance by completing the application available at the Administration Office. A form is included for you in this pack.

**PLEASE NOTE:** ABSTUDY recipients can apply for the Secondary Assistance Scheme Allowance if they are eligible.

## CentrePay: the easy way to pay bills.

**Cash/Cheque/EFTPOS** payments can be made at the Administration Office. Alternatively, you can forward cheques or credit card information including CVC (on the bottom of C&C account) by mail to the College.

**Phone the College** - we can take your credit card details over the phone should you choose to pay this way.

**Payment Plan** - we understand that some families find it difficult to pay the whole account at once, a payment plan can be negotiated with you for regular payments.

## Student Services \$10

We are proud of the holistic student services we offer at Kiara College including Psychologist, non-denominational Chaplain, Nurse, Year Coordinators, Student Services Manager, Student Service Support Officers and Aboriginal and Islander Education Officers (AIEO). We believe our students should benefit from an excellent level of support. This cost exceeds the funding that we receive from the Government and therefore we rely on the money we raise from this request.

# STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE

## Information regarding coverage and your responsibilities

The Department of Education does not provide personal accident insurance for students and as a result does not have a whole of college accident insurance in place.

Parents of students in public schools are generally responsible for paying the costs of medical treatment for injured students.

Student insurance policies are available from the private insurance market. These cover a range of medical expenses not covered by Medicare and a range of low-cost policies.

It is also recommended that you have a Family Ambulance cover that covers the student
